The joy of moving abroad for your career or higher education sounds exciting. But there is a lot to be done when it comes to preparing how to study overseas. One of the most important steps you need to think of is which exams to take to study abroad?

For study abroad, the most important international entrance exams are IELTS, GRE, TOEFL, SAT, GMAT, Duolingo, PTE, MCAT and LSAT. These scores are necessary for skill assessments and admission to universities & colleges across the globe.

They're conducted to assess language skills and technical skills. Students must write the exam, get the minimum score required for university admission and submit them before the validity expires. In this article, we tell you the most common competitive entrance exams to study abroad.

The following exams are mandatory for a degree overseas and also for scholarships, stay-back and everything else. Besides, the exams prove your ability and proficiency in a certain area, for instance IELTS is for validating your English skills, while GMAT is to prove that you have the acumen to take up business and management studies.

Since each of the exams have specific requirements, you must check what your goals are and where your goals are aligned with. It's not a wise idea to jump in with any exam you come across for the sake of taking an exam to study overseas.

15 Entrance Exams to Study Abroad

There are several advantages to studying abroad. But, the first hurdle to overseas education is cracking the admission exams.

The common exams you need to appear for to study abroad in 2023 are as follows:



1. Pearson Language Test (PTE)

PTE is accepted by major universities and colleges in the United States, Australia, New Zealand, Canada and the United Kingdom. It assesses your ability to communicate effectively by testing your reading, writing, speaking, and listening ability.

The test score is valid for 2 years and is scored against the global scale of English. Check out what your PTE score stands for -

There is no age bar for taking up the PTE test. You must be at least 16 years of age. The exam fee is around 13,000, and the exam happens multiple times in a year. PTE doesn't have eligibility criteria per se. The exam happens online, for a duration of 3 hours. You can learn more about Kanan's PTE prep here.

2. Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT)

SAT is for admissions into undergraduate programmes in the United States and Canada. SAT is a written test; it tests students' language skills and mathematical skills.

SAT is administered by the <u>College Board</u>. The exam has 2 types of formats - with an essay and without an essay, each lasting for 3 hours and 3 hours 50 minutes. The exam is scored on a scale of 200 to 800 points. The exam fee is around 40 to 60\$ based on whether you take up the essay section or not.

3. Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL)

Administered by ETS, TOEFL is one of the top English proficiency tests widely accepted by some of the best countries to study

abroad. Over 11,000 universities and other institutions in over 150 countries, including Australia, Canada, New Zealand, the United States and the United Kingdom accept TOEFL iBT scores from Indian students.

TOEFL is a 4-hour long computerised test, assessing a candidate on 4 major English skills - reading, writing, listening and writing.

There is also a paper-based version of the test. The exam is scored on a scale of 0 to 120, and the exam fee in India is around Rs.

13,000 for PBT, and the iBT cost may range anywhere from 11,000 to 17,000 in India. The exam is available throughout the year, with 50 exam dates so far.

4. Graduate Management Admission Test (GMAT)

GMAT is used to assess a candidate's analytical, writing, quantitative, verbal, and reading skills. It is administered and managed by the Graduate Management Admission Council. The exam is mainly used for MBA admissions by leading business schools around the world. Countries like Canada, Germany, and the USA accept GMAT scores.

The exam fee is close to 20,000 in India, and the exam duration is close to 2 hours 45 minutes. The test score is assessed on a scale of 200 to 800, with the average score being 550.

5. Graduate Record Examination (GRE)

Offered and managed by <u>ETS</u>, the GRE is for graduate school admission. The test is accepted by all English-speaking countries, particularly Canada, Australia, and the USA. Most of the European universities do not require GRE or have it optional in certain cases. Also, over 1200 business schools accept GRE all over the world.

The exam is delivered online and tests a candidate's ability of verbal reasoning, quantitative reasoning and writing as well.

The exam fee is now 213 US\$, and it's offered throughout the year; there are no specific dates for GRE. GRE is valid for 5 years from the date you get your results. Due to the ongoing pandemic, ETS has launched GRE at home - an initiative to speed up the test-taking

6. International English Language Testing System (IELTS):

The no. 1 English proficiency test widely accepted across various countries, <u>IELTS</u> is taken up by over 5 million people across 140 nations, every year. Jointly owned by British Council and IDP, IELTS is for testing the communication skills of test takers across 4 major areas - writing, speaking, reading and listening. The test is measured on a scale of 0 to 9, with an average band of 6 being accepted worldwide.

IELTS is accepted by major universities for undergraduate and postgraduate admissions in countries like Australia, Canada, and the USA. Trusted by over 11,000 organizations, IELTS is of 2 types - academic and general.

The test is available multiple times in a year, with an exam fee of 14,000. The exam comes in both the computer-delivered format and paper-based format. The validity of the test score is for 2 years.

7. Medical College Admission Test (MCAT):

Conducted by the Association of American Medical Colleges (AAMC) and administered by Pearson VUE, Medical College Admission

Test (MCAT) is an entrance test for admissions into medical schools in the United States, Canada, Australia and Carribean Islands. The exam takes place 25 times across 21 countries every vear.

The MCAT exam fee is around \$315 – 360. It's mainly used to assess a candidate's analysis, reasoning, psychological skills and the knowledge of biological systems. The overall MCAT score lies between 472 and 528.

8. Law School Admission Test (LSAT):

Administered by the Law School Admission Council, LSAT is of two types: LSAT Indian and LSAT abroad. LSAT abroad is for admissions into leading law schools in the USA, Canada and Australia. The exam is conducted 6 times in a year. It happens online and lasts for 3 hours 30 minutes. The exam fee is US\$180.

9. American College Testing (ACT):

A standardized exam to test high-school readiness, ACT is primarily for admissions into colleges in the USA, and considered to be one of the most trusted exams in the country. However, Canada is yet another country that accepts SAT scores.

ACT lasts for 3 hours [technically, it takes 2 hours 55 minutes], with 4 sections - Math, Reading, Science, and English; there is an optional writing section. The exam is scored on a scale of 1-36, with 21 being the average score.

10. Canadian Academic English Language Assessment (CAEL):

CAEL is Canada's trusted English Language test for study. It's accepted by over 180 post-secondary institutions in Canada. The test is used by employers, schools, colleges, and universities as a proof of English language skills.

The exam lasts for 3.5 hours and comprises Speaking, Integrated Reading and Listening, and academic Units A and B. There are only 2 CAEL test centres in India - at Chandigarh and Ahmedabad. The exam fee is close to 11K. Check out cael.ca

11. Cambridge English Advanced (CAE)

Offered by Cambridge ESOL, <u>CAE</u> is a proof of your English skills. CAE scores are accepted by major UK universities for admissions. Canada, the USA, and Spain also accept CAE scores for admissions in higher education institutions. The exam has 4 sections - reading, writing, listening, and speaking. Currently, in India the CAE exam fee is around Rs. 6000.

12. Cambridge English Proficiency Exam (CPE)

Also known as Certificate of Proficiency in English, CPE is also offered by Cambridge ESOL. Over 2700 centres conduct CPE exams all over the world. The exam fee is around Rs. 6700. Over 2500 universities and organizations around the world accept Cambridge English exams, including CPE.

13. Examination for the Certificate of Competency in English (ECCE):

The test of general English language competency, the ECCE is awarded by the University of Michigan. It shows your fluency in English and can be used to show your skills to employers.

The ECCE test stands at the B2 level of the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR). It is accepted by many institutions in Canada, New Zealand, Australia, France and the USA and UK. The exam fee varies based on the test center, but is usually around 150\$.

14. Advanced Placement (AP) Exams:

Managed by the <u>College Board</u>, AP is a college-level exam for high school students for placement in well-known universities. AP scores are accepted by over 700 universities in 60 countries, including the USA, UK, and Canada. The exam fee is around 125\$.

15. Duolingo Test:

Duolingo test is now accepted by over 1000 institutions in the USA, Australia, Canada, China, and Ireland. It's a computerised, home-based test. And it costs about 49 USD. Available on demand @duolingo.com, the test lasts for 60 minutes. The test score usually ranges around 10-160, with 120 being the average score accepted by most universities and colleges abroad.

- GRE Exam is for admissions to graduate schools in countries like the USA, the UK, and Australia.
- Law School Admission Test or LSAT is a graduate exam for admissions into law schools in countries like the USA and Canada.
- Medical College Admission Test or MCAT is compulsory for admissions into medicine courses in the United States.

Entrance exams to study abroad after 12th and 10th

Can I study abroad after 12th from India? Or can I study overseas after 10th?

We often hear these questions from the students who visit us.
